Italian Studies Highlights

Italian Studies minor **Gianna Schiavo** was awarded the Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship to pursue her research in Sicily in the summer of 2022. While abroad, she will engage in a research project with her faculty mentor, **Dr. Tessa Gurney**, in which she investigates the practice of *caporalato*, or the illegal exploitation of vulnerable workers in the agricultural sector by Italian agromafias.

Students from Dr. Gurney's Italian for Business class participated in the Casa della Cultura Italiana's conference on Italian Innovation and Technology at the NC Food Innovation Lab in Charlotte (pictured above), and a whopping thirty-two students have been selected to participate in HPU's Faculty-led Maymester program in Siracusa, Sicily in 2022 with Dr. Gurney and **Dr. Anna Love**.

◆ The Latin American Student Organization (LASO) hosted several events throughout the semester to promote and celebrate Latin American culture. These included a Día de los Muertos conversation on why the holiday is essential for Hispanic culture and how people from different countries celebrate it; Comida Hispana, a collaboration with Lambda Pi Chi and SGA, in which participants learned about traditional dishes from a variety of Hispanic countries; and an Aguas Frescas Social, where students learned about and tried conventional drinks from Hispanic cultures, such as "Agua de horchata" and "Batidos y refrescos."



- * Students from **Spanish for the Medical Professions (SPN 2141)** partnered with the **Community Clinic of High Point** to complete their service-learning hours for the Fall 2021 semester. Their responsibilities at the clinic were varied and included triaging patients, making patient appointment reminder phone calls, translating medical forms, working at the flu clinic, assisting with eligibility interviews, and other necessary administrative tasks. The students were able to put to use their Spanish-language skills and course content knowledge while at the clinic. Through their time there they gained an appreciation of how a non-profit clinic operates and of its work to address disparities that exist in health care. The course is taught by **Carolyn Adams**.

During their time at HPU, Denn-Thiele served as president of the Spanish Club and Rainer was president of Latinas Promoviendo Comunidad/Lambda Pi Chi Sorority Inc. 
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Professional Announcements
